OVERVIEW OF EVALUATION ACTIVITIES

KEY ACTIVITIES FOR QI 2023

In the first quarter of 2023, the evaluation team focused on developing draft and final 2023 impact evaluation reports. The evaluation team also finalized 2023 evaluation plans and continued to execute select 2022 evaluation activities. In conjunction with these activities, the evaluation team actively participated in SAG Policy Manual Subcommittee, NTG Working Group, and TAC meetings over the course of Q1.

UPCOMING ACTIVITIES FOR Q2 2023

In the second quarter of 2023, the evaluation team will review and respond to AIC and stakeholder comments on the 2022 impact evaluation reports and issue final versions. The evaluation team will also issue the 2023 Integrated Evaluation Report and supporting evaluation materials such as the Portfolio CPAS and AAIG workbook.

Additional items of note include:

- Conducting the 2022 cost effectiveness analysis and submitting the cost effectiveness report
- Finalizing a summary of 2022 LLLC evaluation findings, as well as reviewing the LLLC natural market baseline and preparing customer and trade ally surveys
- Finalizing the Mobile Homes Community Mapping and TRM Gap Analysis memos
- Submitting the IQ Single Family Program Ally memo
- Ongoing Multifamily process evaluation activities including fielding a property manager survey
- Developing data collection instruments to support evaluation of the Residential Midstream HVAC Channel
- Kicking off Business Program NTG research for Standard, Midstream Lighting, Midstream HVAC and Virtual Commissioning
- Planning activities for the Custom Initiative process evaluation

- Development of the Non-Participant Spillover survey instrument
- Participating in SAG working group and TAC meetings as needed
